With so many public, private, and daycare facilities around our city, traffic stays constant and busy both in the mornings, and in the early afternoons. We are ALL in a hurry each and everyday, but the commission is asking everyone to drive cautiously within in our city and neighboring cities being on the lookout for walkers, bike-riders, and all other traffic that is sharing the roads. For the next few weeks, we will see darker mornings, which makes visibility even harder. Please, please drive with care and lessen distractions when driving.

As stated above, we will "Fall Back" with the time so our evenings will see less daylight but hopefully the city roads will continue to be utilized for walkers and others with our newer LED street lights that Commissioner Leslie Beam took charge of over the summer. With the Fall season comes falling leaves from trees and we are very pleased to announce that the city-wide leaf removal **will take place again** this year. We will send out dates when finalized, but it will happen twice during the fall season. Based on feedback we will move the first pickup the first week of November and have the second pickup be the week after Thanksgiving since the city has so many trees that drop leaves so late in the season.

During this pandemic, the City of Bellewood was able to apply for the American Rescue Plan Act which would give stimulus to all cities across the nation. We did apply for those funds and just received our first portion of those funds over the summer. The restrictions on these funds is many so the commission is working with our city attorney, Finn Cato, the Kentucky League of Cities and the Department of Local Governments to see where these funds can be appropriated. We are hoping that we can use these for new and updated roads within our city. More information to come as we await the full direction that these funds can be spent.
